Since joining CLARE|MATRIX as Executive Director/CEO in March 2023, it's been both humbling and heartwarming to become acquainted with such a dedicated, engaged community of supporters. I am deeply grateful.

ABOUT CLARE|MATRIX

CLARE | MATRIX saves lives by providing compassionate, evidence-based treatment for those who struggle with drugs, alcohol, and related behavioral health challenges. We provide an integrated care delivery model that: **meets our participants where they are, with what they need, when they are ready.**

Our three-part care model combines an evidence-based regimen of medication, behavioral therapy, and spiritual and peer support. This approach is designed to promote long-term recovery and lifelong healing for those we serve. We define long-term recovery, or "success", as when an individual, once hopelessly afflicted with SUD, is sufficiently recovered to be a self-supporting member of society and extend their hand to help others similarly afflicted.

We have helped save over 100,000 lives!



OUR IMPACT

Last year, CLARE|MATRIX provided recovery treatment to 1,029 people across seven programs:

Men's Residential Treatment Program:
245 people served

Women's Residential Treatment Program:
267 people served

Outpatient Santa Monica:
152 people served

Outpatient Ontario:
198 people served

Opioid Treatment Program:
111 people served

Recovery Bridge Housing:
18 people served

Youth Prevention Programs:
38 people served

1,243 people trained in
overdose prevention and 1,322
naloxone packs distributed*

*On average, 1 in 5 distributed naloxone
kits is used to reverse an overdose!

On May 5, 2024, CLARE|MATRIX hosted its 2024 Tribute Dinner Fundraiser at the Skirball Cultural Center. The event recognized the exceptional contributions made to the recovery community by: [Shireen Janti](#), a respected recovery professional with over three decades of experience as a Certified Professional Coach, Licensed Advanced Alcohol and Drug Counselor, and Certified Relapse Prevention Specialist, the [Los Angeles Trial Lawyers' Charities](#) (LATLC), a prominent nonprofit supporting local causes, including their life-changing work with C|M participants, and [Jeff Greenberg](#), owner and CEO of The Village recording studio in West Los Angeles and significant recovery advocate.

The program included live music, a special in-memory video to a long-standing member of the community [Dorothy Richards](#), and testimonials from CLARE | MATRIX program alumni [Andria Medina](#) and [Anthony Arenas](#).

On the night of the event, we successfully raised funds to support the admissions and intake process for forty individuals seeking treatment. Altogether, the event generated enough to transition over 130 people into SUD treatment services, highlighting the powerful impact of our collective efforts to combat addictions and support long-term recovery.

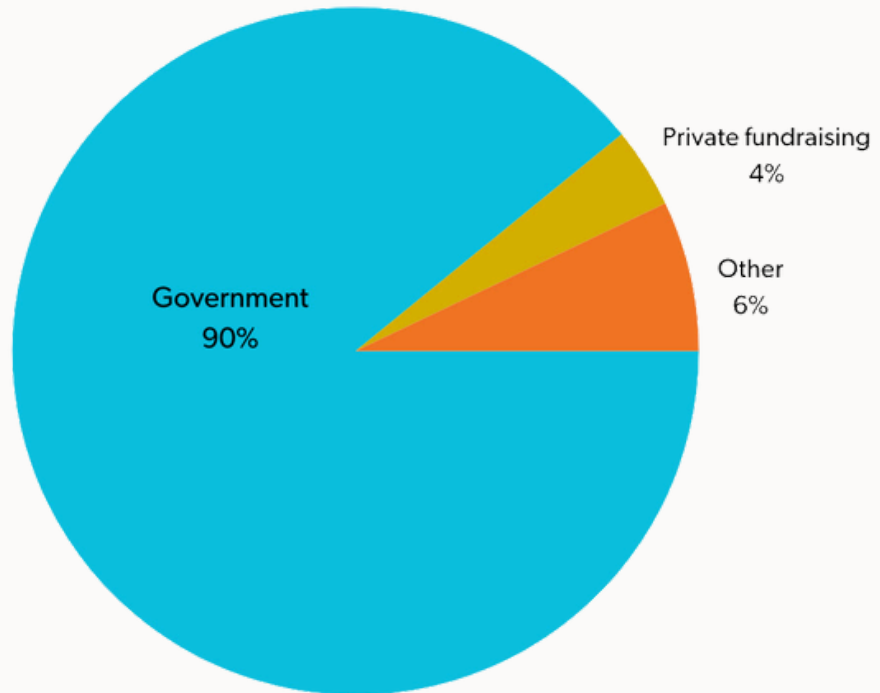
